What are Sanatana Scriptures?





It's like a superhero book that teaches us to do our best and be kind every day




The Ramayana: The Adventure of Prince Rama

It tells the tale of two groups of cousins—the Pandavas and the Kauravas—who had a big disagreement about ruling a kingdom.


The Mahabharata teaches us to choose what is right, even when it's hard, and to be honest, brave, and fair to everyone.
